Functions as an advocate for youth and families with Children Services, courts and other community agencies. Attends client reviews to update treatment plans and ensure compliance with standards. Attends weekly individual and group supervision, team meetings and required or recommended trainings as assigned by the clinical director. Transports clients in agency-owned or personal vehicle as needed. Serves on an agency committee. Completes other duties as assigned.
